

Bahir Dar, Ethiopia - the first facility of its kind in the country designed to offer multi-interventional services for the deaf community and their families. The center, which builds off of our existing and ongoing work at Yekatit 23 School, is now providing services to deaf youth & young adults, families, teachers, university students, and community members through a wide range of education & development programs that are dramatically changing the status quo. Some of our recent efforts include the following:

- Establishment of an **early childhood education** program for deaf 3-5 year old children
- Conducting weekly trainings in Ethiopian Sign Language for parents & families (once per week), teachers & staff (once per week), and hearing children at Yekatit 23 School (twice per week)
- Conducting **computer training** for students three times per week
- Laying the foundation for a **hearing assessment & counseling center** and conducting first round of tests
- Selection of 20 young adults to benefit from a livelihoods development initiative
- Hiring of **2 new deaf teachers** (bringing the total number to 4) and **2 interpreters** to serve 80+ children amongst 3 public schools in the Bahir Dar District
- Construction of a **new classroom** for deaf schoolchildren at Yekatit 23 School
- Developing educational and community outreach materials

Within just the first few months of this initiative, which is part of a year-long grant made possible by the Dream Blue Foundation, the situation for deaf youth & young adults and the understanding of deafness in general amongst the public in Bahir Dar has improved dramatically. Looking to the future, we have much to accomplish, and look forward to sharing our work on the ground with the 2 scheduled groups of volunteers visiting Ethiopia in June (8 students & faculty from SUNY New Paltz) and August (11 volunteers).

Another very exciting recent development has been the launch of the next phase of our Visions Leadership Program in India, which has seen the expansion of the program from 55 students to 600! Following an initial Training of Trainers for 30 community workers/educators employed by our local partner organization (the Arcot Lutheran Church School Project), conducted this past March, Visions is now serving youth across 15 different villages, most of which are in rural and impoverished areas.

These students are now receiving regular leadership development training, daily after-school tuition, and mentoring, and have access to periodic service opportunities to put their newfound skills and talents into practice. Simple structures equipped with electricity were established in each of the 15 benefitting villages so that students will have a safe and well-lit place to study. Visions also hired its first full-time staff in India to lead this program, Mr. Shylet Moni, an experienced development professional and curriculum developer.

The Visions Leadership Academy in Sri Lanka also continues to offer thorough and multi-disciplinary support to 55 young men and women, including regular after-school tuition, leadership training, social & cultural activities, and mentoring. Each year, a new batch of students circulates into this ongoing program.

- Supporting 3 teachers' salaries for the past 3 years
- Provided 10 classroom chalkboards and school signboards
- Established soccer field and playground
- Youth and teacher trainings

And in a recent development, we are proud to announce we will be following through on our commitment to establish a library (the "Sivamani Family & Friends Library") at the school later this year!

I.T. SCHOOL FOR GIRLS IN INDIA

In a major development, Visions is preparing to establish an IT school for underprivileged girls in India. Slated to be our biggest undertaking to-date, this project was recently launched through a private donor. A team of Visions representatives recently traveled to India in March to scout prospective properties, with a follow-up scouting trip to Tamil Nadu scheduled for early July.
