happy! I've been to many gatherings and meetings in the past, but never before, have I met anyone like the Visions volunteers!" Daniel Raja, one of the 56 youth selected from 8 schools in Dalit-majority communities of Thirukkovilur, Tamil Nadu, India, was bursting with excitement on the concluding day of the Visions Leadership training. For the 7 international Visions volunteers and handful of local volunteers and teachers who conducted 48 hours of residential leadership training over 6 days, the separation from the dynamic group of youth who had visibly transformed in confidence and motivation, was equally difficult.

Now in our 9th year of conducting youth leadership trainings in India and Sri Lanka, Visions has reached a significant milestone, having conducted two-dozen trainings, directly benefitting more than 1,400 youth. Our first training this year was held in Thirukoilur, Tamil Nadu, India from July 21-26, hosted by our new partner, the Arcot Lutheran Church (ALC). We are now in the process of working with ALC to ensure that our leadership development efforts are sustained year-round as we continue to

engage the vouth whom we have previously trained.



Our second leadership training this summer was conducted by 2 international volunteers for 40 secondary school youth attending Saiva Mangaiyar Vidyalayam (Hindu Ladies College) in Colombo, Sri Lanka from August 2nd-9th. With the completion of the Kalagam Visions Learning Centre earlier this year, which has been designed to serve as both a school extension and a Visions training facility,

Launch of \$100K Jayalakshmi Ramachandran Scholarship Fund to Benefit Disadvantaged Youth in India

Visions is proud to announce the launch of our newest initiative--the establishment of the Jayalakshmi Ramachandran Scholarship Fund to benefit disadvantaged students pursuing higher education in Tamil Nadu, India in partnership with the Nandalala Seva Samithi Trust (NSST) based in Chennai, India. The fund is being established in memory of Jayalakshmi Ramachandran, mother of Pujyashri Mathi Oli R. Saraswathy (founder of NSST), whose vision was to help underprivileged students realize their dreams and ambitions through the gift of education. "Paati", as she was fondly referred to, was a generous, compassionate and inspirational mother to many. Through the generosity of a donor, Visions is donating \$100,000 as corpus for running the "Jayalakshmi Ramachandran Scholarship Program". The interest generated annually from this endowment fund will be used to administer and award financial support to underprivileged students in India, who wish to pursue higher education and lack the means to do so otherwise.

This program strives to create and empower a network of students from underprivileged backgrounds who are motivated to pursue and complete their higher education. We also plan to provide mentorship support for and among scholarship recipients, while working to create a network of empowered, socially-minded students and professionals. The scholarship award will cover the cost of tuition fees based on merit for students who have been accepted into a Government recognized college/ institution but have not been awarded any other scholarship for their tuition fees. Scholarship selection will prioritize those who are girls, underprivileged, orphaned, or from a single parent family. The scholarship will cover tuition fees for each year of the full degree/diploma, provided that the student meets the eligibility criteria as specified by the selection committee. Donations from students' parents, whenever possible, will be encouraged, so that parents retain the responsibility and motivation to invest in their ward's education. We look forward to sharing updates on this program with you next year when we announce our first batch of recipients.

Strengthening Ties & Forming New Partnerships in India

In 2008 Visions branched into South India, forging our first partnership with local NGO partner SAWED Trust (Social Action Womens Education and Development). The exceptionally efficient and hard-working team at SAWED Trust has handled the logistics of all our Visions leadership trainings in India since then, and we are extremely grateful for their commitment and support. Aside from the work they do

organizing our annual leadership trainings, the organization runs a number of programs targeted at supporting and empowering youth, women, and society's most vulnerable groups. One major undertaking SAWED Trust is currently working on is the development of a boarding school to benefit tribal children from impoverished villages in the Lower Palani Hills in Dindigul, Tamil Nadu. In support of this effort, Visions contributed \$1,000 to SAWED Trust for the school construction, which is scheduled to open in June 2012. Looking to the future, we plan to be involved in supporting this school through trainings and other assistance.

Volunteers who came to India this summer were able to meet with another new partner organization, SCOPE India Trust, and visit 3 of their Children's Learning Centres that Visions is supporting in and around Madurai, Tamil Nadu. We are currently in discussions with a few other organizations and are expecting to have more details about these partnerships and planned efforts to share with you in our next enewsletter. With so much in the works, we need your continued support!
