# Launch of New Women's Leadership Initiative in Sri Lanka

This June we were fortunate to have Dr. Darshan Ambalavanar (Director of Diaconal Ministries & Director of Theological Education at the Church of the American Ceylon Mission (CACM) in Sri Lanka) visit us here in Southern California for a few days. During his visit, Darshan was able to speak to audiences in Orange County and Lancaster about CACM's work and the value of Visions' partnership over the years. After the war in Sri Lanka officially ended, between May 2011 and January 2018, Visions invested over \$150,000 in education programs under CACM, including afterschool programs, youth leadership programs and higher education scholarships in the Eastern Province - mostly in hard-to-reach, poverty-stricken villages around Batticaloa.

In addition, he shared the details of a new effort that would further strengthen civil society in NE Sri Lanka - a women's leadership initiative called "Ezhuvazh" (a Tamil word which translates to "She Will Rise"). This new program will benefit up to 15 young women A/L graduates who will participate in a 6-month English training followed by a 4-month residential leadership training. Final preparations are being made now with an anticipated launch date of later this month.

We wish to thank everyone who made contributions to this important program, which we are proud to say will meet the full financial need of this first batch of young women (estimated at \$22,650 total). We look forward to sharing more updates on this exciting new undertaking with you all as the project develops!

# **Expanding Education Services for Deaf Youth in Ethiopia**

After focusing our efforts on the city of Bahir Dar (*Amhara Region*) for the past 7 years, we marked a new chapter in the evolution of our work by expanding our Deaf education & empowerment work to 2 new cities - **Addis Ababa** (*the nation's capital*) and **Awassa** (*capital of the Southern Nations, Nationalities and Peoples Region*). As a first step, we hired 3 new Visions Ethiopia staff, including a Deaf educator (Mr. Jambo Gemechu) & Interpreter (Ms. Sifen Teka) in Awassa and a Deaf educator (Ms. Atsedemariam Milkias) in

academic trajectory of the more than 400 youth they collectively serve.

# 3. Deaf Student Transportation (Ethiopia): \$1,200/city

In Ethiopia, we have identified a number of Deaf children who would attend school and our educational support programs, but who simply live too far away. By providing transportation support, we can bring into our fold on average an additional 10-15 students per city (in each of our 3 locations of Addis Ababa, Awassa and Bahir Dar) at a cost of roughly \$1,200/year per city.

To become a sponsor for any of these efforts and help support these vital educational opportunities for

During the past few months, these new staff have been getting ready for the year ahead and conducting summer classes in Ethiopian Sign Language for parents / family members of Deaf students & early language learners, as well as English lessons for students in general. In Bahir Dar, we have also continued to conduct our regular summer activities for Deaf students, including tutoring support in English, Amharic, mathematics & Ethiopian Sign Language, and sign language training for hearing students.

Once schools officially reopen this month, classrooms for Deaf preschool / early language learners will open their doors to students in both locations, providing critical language- and skills-development support to a crucial demographic. We are also planning to introduce a number of other educational support programs in these 2 new locations, including after-school tutoring in various subjects, Ethiopian Sign Language training for hearing students, teachers & family members of Deaf students, and special programs and events.


# Celebrating 3 Years of Visions India (while looking to the future...)



On August 19th of this year, our Visions Global Empowerment India team proudly celebrated completion of the first 3 years of their education & community development work! We also celebrated the graduation of the first 4 university scholars to complete their degrees. Of those 4 young people, 3 are now working toward higher education degrees and 1 is now working as a teacher.

In July, a 2-day leadership training was held for our 14 Community Organizers who collectively serve more than 400 children from rural, low caste communities through our after-school Learning & Empowerment Centers. The topics of this training focused on Inclusion, Reading / Literacy, and Self-Confidence. In follow up to this training, our Visions India staff have been putting together bins of English- and Tamil-language books to be used on an ongoing rotational basis amongst these after-school centers to promote reading & literacy - a wonderful new addition to our programming!

A 2-day leadership training in **Self-Confidence and Career Planning** was also conducted for our university scholars who came from all over the state of Tamil Nadu for a weekend of fun, learning and reflection. This year 12 of 21 scholarship students are scheduled to graduate, most of whom plan to enter the work force



while a few plan to continue their studies. We could not be more proud of them all...
