

OVERVIEW OF VISIONS' SRI LANKA PROGRAMS:

Investing in Education & Building the Capacity of Local Civil Society

In many developing and middle-income countries around the world, a quality education is a luxury. The key to achieving development goals & sustainability in international development lies in creating robust educational systems and investing in the human capital of local communities themselves.

Over the past 13 years, Visions has nurtured partnerships with dozens of local civil society organizations that are the change-makers in their own communities – the locally-rooted, innovative problem solvers, idea generators, and program administrators serving the most vulnerable & disadvantaged in their area and helping to stimulate growth.



Visions' secret to success has been in responding to specific needs and opportunities identified by local actors themselves and further empowering them to better create change. Building on the ongoing work of these local partners (many of whom have worked in their respective communities for decades), we help them to develop programs and achieve development goals by supplementing their efforts with our expertise and resources.

We provide support through consultation, training, funding, strategy development, program development, curriculum development, and much more in order to maximize results, while the local partners themselves take ownership over and responsibility for local implementation & management. As always, Visions' goal is to unleash the vast amounts of untapped human potential in the communities we strive to serve.

❖ CHINMAYA ORGANISATION FOR RURAL DEVELOPMENT (COLOMBO, SRI LANKA)

Working in close partnership with the CORD Sri Lanka team, Visions provided support in developing organizational systems and a marketing strategy & materials. CORD Sri Lanka also facilitated several youth scholarships and the delivery of more than 4,000 library books to schools in Jaffna (2009-2012).

Provided support for 150 Internally Displaced Youth (IDPs) to continue with their education (2010).

 Collaborated in the development of a Youth Leadership Academy, in which 112 youth from various isolated & disadvantaged communities in Eastern Sri Lanka have participated in an intensive leadership development program designed to develop skills,

- enhance knowledge & understanding of the world, and encourage youth to step forward as leaders for their communities & country (2013 2017).
- Supported after-school programs for more than 850 youth whose education was disrupted on account of the civil conflict and/or other hardship in Vaharai, Karadiyanaru, Suthanthirapuram, & Neeravipitty in Eastern Sri Lanka (2011 – 2014).
- Provided scholarship support to a number of high-achieving youth in financial need to pursue higher education or vocational/professional training opportunities.
- Organized various teacher trainings for public school teachers in Batticaloa (2012 2015).
- Drawing upon the talents & knowledge of both international and local volunteers, conducted special youth leadership trainings and arts camps in Batticaloa (2011 2013).
- Brought 4 staff persons to India for networking, capacity-building, and exposure visit (2010).
- Provided various equipment & resources in support of ongoing educational & community development initiatives (2012 2017).
- ❖ HINDU BOARD OF EDUCATION (JAFFNA, SRI LANKA)

Bank accounts were established and future savings scholarships were provided to 10 young men at this Jaffna-based boys orphanage (2007), following two 2-week youth leadership summer camps that were conducted (2004 – 2005).

Provided financial support for the development of an organizational website (www.irdg.org.lk) (2016).
